






Helping Communities Grow Stronger


Child Enrichment Services offers childcare for infants, toddlers, preschoolers and before/after school and summer programs for school-age children ages 5-12 in Elyria and Lorain.











You help us work better! In 2014, Neighborhood Alliance Family Support Services truly made strides in a positive direction as they expanded their team to accommodate the growing demand for support in Lorain County. This program also known as "Help Me Grow ®" has become a staple for families in this community. Retention has remained high as the majority of families who enter this program do not leave until their children age out at 3 years old.

In 2014 not only did the Family Support Services team grow but they also added a collaborative with a variety of other developmental specialists in the area. This collaborative has cleverly been called "Teaming" as these specialist/ providers and supporters all come together to discuss the best plan of action for children in their programs. The advantages of working this way greatly simplifies relationships with the specialist team by ensures family receives coordinated advice, is involved in all decision-making and is empowered to better manage demands upon their time which reduces stress upon family. This change will be felt throughout our community for years to come.


Family Support Services facilitates in-home parenting education and support, program referrals and developmental screening for families with children up to three years old.











You help me not be so lonely! Why are senior citizens living alone? Do they have someone to help them? These are great questions but the fact is that most options aren't easily attainable. Many have not properly planned for this stage of life; and the legacies they've built they want to hold on to. With limited support as younger generations move away to discover their own futures, many elderly are left alone.

Serving so much more than a meal at the doorsteps of Lorain County's elderly, Neighborhood Alliance Senior Meal Delivery driver **Jimmy Torres** was honored in March 2014 by the **American Red Cross Lorain County** for saving the life of an elderly woman who had fallen in her home.

Jimmy Torres, a Senior Nutrition driver with Neighborhood Alliance called 911 today while delivering meals on his Elyria route. Jimmy heard the faint cry for help through the door of his clients' home and immediately leaped into action. Usually this particular client would leave the door unlocked for Jimmy to enter and deliver her meals, however today the door remained locked. The authorities were forced to take out a window air-conditioning unit in order to enter the clients' home. It is still unclear how long the client had been on the ground following her fall, but there is no telling how long she would have remained laying there without this meal delivery from Neighborhood Alliance.


Senior Nutrition Home Delivered Meals Program provides nutritionally balanced meals to the frailest of seniors and severely handicapped in Lorain County.











You help me stay social! Life isn't always fair but every now and then someone comes into your life that makes those growing pains just a little bit easier. The Neighborhood Alliance Senior Enrichment Center in Oberlin brings together friendly faces and good conversation all year long for active seniors in the community.

During 2014, one of the programs that many are grateful for is the free lunch which is served every Monday at 11:00am. It is a significant way for seniors to socialize and stay connected with friends, make new acquaintances, and be less isolated than they might be if they stayed home. It is also a way for them to enjoy entertainment or learn about a variety of topics from speakers who share their expertise or even visit with nurses to ask questions.


Senior Enrichment Services of Oberlin provides supportive services and engaging social programs to active elderly in Lorain County.











Your gift keeps on giving! What if you were locked in your home and could only speak to 1 person for 5 minutes a day for the rest of your life? This is reality for most of Lorain County's home bound senior population. The only interactions these elderly have during the week are with their senior home delivered meal drivers. The drivers bring life sustaining meals directly to the doorstep as well as a friendly smile and well check to seniors who have no other support.

The willingness and ability to serve others comes with great rewards. Neighborhood Alliance offers many unique opportunities to volunteer and get involved. Through the Next Step Ministries partnership in 2014, not only were we able to bring groups of young people to the homes of lonely senior citizens for the summer, but we were also able to introduce "Community Picnics" to neighborhoods surrounding Oak Wood Park in Lorain. Every Thursday evening during the 10 week summer Senior Home Repair Program, the volunteers and Next Step summer staff came together for fellowship, BBQ and activities in the park after their home renovation projects were completed for the day. Each week the attendance of community members grew steadily as word spread.

The goal of these picnics is to rebuild the concept of neighbor. It is our hope that neighbors will look out for these lonely elderly and bring back the meaning of neighborhood. Bringing them back to a time where neighbors look out for each other and take pride in the rehabilitation of their community.


Senior Home Repair Program provides volunteer groups to serve throughout a 10-week program as outreach to seniors whose homes are in need of repair.











Your support helped 114 children! It's incrediby humbling to ask for help, especially when you are leading your family through the doors of a homeless shelter. Neighborhood Alliance Shelter and Emergency Services operates the Haven Center Homeless Shelter in Lorain, Ohio. More than ever before families are finding themselves in need. Many resort to sleeping in cars or maybe even on a family members couch. However when you have multiple children under the age of 5, both of these options quickly become impossibilities.

"I received several calls today from females with children looking for shelter, that is the majority of the calls I receive. There are no other reasons, except they are (the ones) who are the most poor. Single females with children are the least likely to have good-paying jobs, the least likely to afford market-rate rent and the most likely to be in need."




